Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on the 10 January 2019
in Egloskerry Village Hall at 19.30 hours.

The Minutes of the Meeting held on 8 November 2018 were duly approved and signed by the Vice Chairman as a correct record.

Matters Arising from the Minutes:

1. Play Area -
 - Mr Emmett is making new goal posts.
 - New signage has been placed on the pedestrian gate and looks good.
2. Defibrillator -

Forms have been emailed, namely (1) Project Assistance Request Form – Managed Solution cPAD External Site, and (2) Telephone Kiosk adoption and transfer request.
3. Planning applications –

Application PA18/11227 – Proposed Lawful development certificate for an existing conservatory. - 5 Baron Court, Tregear. Consultee comment – No Objection.
4. Pleasure Ground – a small field situated in Badharlick -
 - An old bank account relating to the above will be closed by a past Chairman and the funds transferred to the Parish Council.
 - This parcel of land has been farmed rent free for many years and will continue on this basis until matters are sorted.
5. Notice Board (near bus shelter) -
 - Mr P [REDACTED] is refurbishing the notice board. Mr Northcott has installed a metal post in readiness.
6. Village Seat -

Permission was granted at the November meeting for the family of Mr B [REDACTED] to refurbish the village seat and place a plaque on it in his memory, however the wording is not as expected. It implies the Parish Council has placed the plaque on the seat in recognition of what Mr B [REDACTED] did for the village. Not wishing to set a precedent or

show favour as there have been so many people over the years that have helped out the village in so many ways, Clerk to write to Mrs W. asking for the wording to be changed explaining the reasons why. The new wording to be approved. Also the W.I. plaque to be repositioned along the top rail, as agreed.

7. St Keri Court -
Concerns over anti-social behaviour, and furniture and rubbish having been dumped on the verge outside No. 1 St Keri Court. Response received from Cornwall Housing that the matter is in hand. The rubbish has since been cleared and fencing erected along No. 1 St Keri Court.
8. Stabling and associated buildings (in field adjacent Trent Villa) -
Emailed received from the Enforcement Team with a link to a complaint form which has been duly completed.
9. 30 mph signage (North Petherwin road) -
Following full support from the Parish Council an email has been sent to highways requesting 30 mph signage to be moved from one side of entrance to the other as obstructing visibility. Response received that hopefully this would be implemented during 2019. Residents updated.
