

Egloskerry Parish Council

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on the 14 March 2019
in Egloskerry Village Hall at 19.30 hours.

Present at Meeting:

Declarations of Interest: None.

Public participation: Permission was granted at the November meeting for the family of Mr B [REDACTED] to refurbish the village seat and place a plaque on it in his memory. The wording was not as expected implying the Parish Council had placed the plaque on the seat in recognition of what Mr B [REDACTED] had done for the village, and not wishing to set a precedent the Clerk wrote to Mrs W [REDACTED] asking for the wording to be changed explaining the reasons why. After discussion at this meeting, the new wording was approved as follows: 'Refurbished in 2019 in memory of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] B [REDACTED] by their family and friends'. This plaque along with the W.I. plaque to be placed along the top rail.

Although welcome to stay, Mrs W [REDACTED] and Mrs M [REDACTED] decided to leave the meeting.

The Minutes of the Meeting held on 10 January 2019 were duly approved and signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

Matters Arising from the Minutes:

1. Play Area -
 - New goal posts being made by Mr C Emmett; to be painted by Councillor Burden.
2. Defibrillator -

Forms having been emailed (Project Assistance Request Form – Managed Solution cPAD External Site, and Telephone Kiosk adoption and transfer request) final paperwork expected to arrive shortly. Clerk to email Community Heartbeat for an update.
3. Planning applications –

Application PA19/00727- Proposal of two traditional gable ended dormer windows to the forward face of the existing first floor bedrooms of the property. Location Cued Mile Failte, Egloskerry – No Objection.
4. Pleasure Ground – a small field situated in Badharlick -
 - An old bank account relating to the above to be closed by a past Chairman and the funds transferred to the Parish Council. Ongoing.

5. Notice Board (near bus shelter) -
Invoice received from Mr P [REDACTED] having refurbished the notice board. Notice Board is now unlocked. Invoice requested from Mr N [REDACTED] having installed the metal post and bracket. Mr N [REDACTED] declined payment. Clerk to write expressing Parish Council's thanks for the various works he has done for the Village.
6. Stabling and associated buildings (in field adjacent Trent Villa) -
A reply from the Enforcement Team indicated a timescale of nine weeks before an update.
7. 30 mph signage (North Petherwin road) -
Residents, having requesting signage to be moved due to obstructing visibility, had recently asked for an update. Highways responded hoping that the work would be carried out in 2019 depending on available resources. Residents updated.

Any Other Business:

1. Letter of Resignation received from Councillor Emmett who had served as a Parish Councillor for over twelve years. Resignation due to health reasons. Clerk to write letter of thanks.
2. Letter of Resignation received from Councillor Sillifant who had served as a Parish Councillor for two years. Resignation due to family and business commitments. Clerk to write letter of thanks.
3. Dog fouling – ongoing problem in various areas of the Village. Councillor Sillifant had tried sourcing signage without success. Clerk to email More Creative Solutions.

4. Various potholes to be reported to include the following - between Hendra Green and Truscott, outside of Tredundle Farm and along the road between the latter and Eastdown End Farm.
5. Dog barking – Clerk had received complaints regarding Councillors Sillifant’s dogs. Problem arising due to dogs having access to the outside when no-one at home. The dogs are now shut in when left on their own and Councillor Sillifant is seeking advice from a dog behaviourist.
6. Resident renting The Hams enquired ownership of the lane leading to the field as a parked car had caused an obstruction on a couple of occasions.
7. Concern over a newly erected shed in a field adjacent to the Village and whether planning permission should have been sought given its size.
